

REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION





Welcome to Prewitt State Wildlife Area. Prewitt is leased by Colorado Parks and Wildlife from the Morgan-Prewitt Irrigation Company with funds from the sale of fishing and hunting licenses. Prewitt has approximately 3,047 acres which are managed primarily for fishing and hunting. Please respect private property and the privilege to use the area.

FEES AND PERMITS

The Habitat Stamp costs \$10.

Individuals only have to purchase *ONE* Habitat Stamp for the entire season (April – March). The lifetime Habitat Stamp costs \$300.25. (Purchase locally at Sterling Wal-Mart)

Anyone aged 18 through 64 must buy a stamp in order to buy or apply for a hunting or fishing license.

Hunters applying for a limited license must purchase a stamp to apply for the drawing process.

Anyone buying a one-day or additional-day license for fishing and/or small game is exempt from purchasing the habitat stamp with the first two of these licenses. The habitat fee will be assessed when a third one-day or additional-day license is purchased for fishing or small game.

Facilities

Two vault toilets are available near the boat ramp, and one toilet at N.E. parking lot.

No sewage disposal sites are available; dumping sewage is prohibited.

Limited vehicle access is available for handicapped fishermen at the outlet house.

Picnic areas, Camping, Hiking, Wildlife Viewing, and Ice Fishing

Area Offers:

Fishing: walleye, saugeye, channel catfish, and black crappie. Wiper, northern pike, and rainbow trout can also be caught.

Hunting: Waterfowl, Pheasant, Bobwhite Ouail. Deer

Recreation: Hunting, Fishing, Camping, Wildlife Viewing

Regulations

Min. size for walleye and saugeye is 15" (only 1 can exceed 21").

Min. size for wiper is 15".

Statewide bag and possession limits also apply.

Ice fishing is restricted to within 50 yards of the dam.

NO boat angling allowed from Oct. 1 through last day of regular goose season.

Boating is prohibited if it creates a whitewater wake.

Clean, drain, and dry all watercraft before launching on and after leaving the reservoir to avoid the spread of aquatic nuisance species.

Restrictions

- A. Boating is prohibited in a manner that creates a white water wake.
- B. Boating is prohibited from October 1 through the last day of the regular goose season except for craft propelled by hand may be used to set and pick up decoys and retrieve downed waterfowl.
- C. Camping and fires are prohibited as posted to protect the property use and livestock of the lesser.
- D. Fishing is restricted to the dam from October 1 through the last day of the migratory waterfowl season. During this time period, ice fishing is restricted to within 50 yards of the dam.
- E. The number of vehicles on the property is limited to two-hundred and fifty (250).
- F. Water-skiing is prohibited.
- G. Sailing and windsurfing are prohibited except during the months of July and August.
- H. Glass beverage containers are prohibited
- I. Hunting is prohibited as posted, to protect resting waterfowl, depending on water levels.
- J. Hunting is prohibited from any floating device.
- K. Minimum size for wipers is 15 inches long.
- L. Minimum size for walleye and saugeye is 15 inches long. Only 1 walleye or saugeye in the aggregate longer than 21 inches can be taken per day.

*In addition to or in place of those restrictions listed in regulation #900 the above listed provisions or restrictions apply (see Chapter 9, http://wildlife.state.co.us/RulesRegs/Regulations/).
